



Draw Your Way to the Bay

- **Materials Needed:**
 - Drawing supplies (pencils, pens, colored pencils, crayons, or paints)
 - Paper
 - Notebook (to answer questions)
- **A watershed is;**
 - An area or ridge of land that separates waters flowing to different rivers, basins, or seas.
 - A land area that channels rainfall and snowmelt to creeks, streams, and rivers, and eventually to outflow points such as reservoirs, bays, and the ocean
- Find your location in your watershed using one of the following links:

- Using the watershed site create an art piece depicting your way to the bay
 - Gather your materials to draw or paint with- use what you have on hand, such as markers, crayons, colored pencils or paints
 - Using one of the watershed sites find a water source closest to you trace your way to the Chesapeake Bay and the ocean beyond
 - Make sure to label all waterways and points where streams/ rivers join
 - Label any towns or markers along streams/ rivers
 - Identify and label types of land use
 - Use arrows to indicate the direction the waterway flows
- Questions to think about while drawing:
 - What is the closest water source to you?
 - What other waterways does it join?
 - What is the name of the watershed you are in?
 - What is the land like around the waterways? What ways does the land change?
 - What body of water does the Bay drain into?
